

IMMUNIZATION REPORT FOR LONG-TERM CARE FACILITIES

Long-term care facilities are required to report the influenza and pneumococcal immunization status of patients and the influenza and hepatitis B immunization status of employees to the Utah Immunization Program. Completion of the annual report is necessary to prevent sanctioning of a facility's license.

The report includes persons who are residents and employees of a facility between October 1 and December 31 of the survey year. The survey is completed online no later than January 31 of the following year. Facilities reporting include hospitals (swing beds and transitional care beds), nursing care facilities, small health care facilities, and type I and type II assisted living facilities. Of the 272 care facilities now operating, 268 (98.5%) reported for 2008.

The portion of the survey reported here is as follows.

Influenza (flu) immunizations: given during the report time period for residents and employees

Pneumococcal immunizations: given at any time for residents only

Hepatitis B immunizations: given at any time to an employee having direct patient contact

(Note: A percentage in *italics* indicates there was a statistically significant improvement from the previous year (p<0.05)
